- Intensity of Learner: Becomes absorbed in area(s) of personal interest explores topics beyond typical age level Learns quickly with little practice Has an exceptional amount of factual knowledge and applies it accurately Uses advanced vocabulary Demonstrates a determination to complete projects on time and at an advanced level
- Analytical Thinker: Demonstrates an interest in challenging situations approaches problems from varied perspective willingness to tackle challenging problems Demonstrates thinking that is complex and unusual for the age-level Skillfully takes apart and reassembles things or ideas Makes up metaphors or analogies Organizes collections of things uniquely likes to plan or arrange things Presents arguments logically Enjoys planning and organizing
